Dear M. Hui:

The Hillside Federation, representing 46 resident and homeowner associations with approximately 250,000 constituents spanning the Santa Monica Mountains, has a long history of supporting wildfire safety in our hillsides. Consistent with the Hillside Federation's mission to encourage and promote those policies and programs which will best preserve the natural topography and wildlife of the mountains and hillsides for the benefit of all the people of Los Angeles, the Federation opposes the proposed CUP for Middle Ranch which would turn the A-2-1 heavy agriculture zoned area into a major event site.

The proposed CUP appears to be a disaster waiting to happen. The Middle Ranch is located in a Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. Middle Ranch is located on Little Tujunga Canyon Road which is an extension of Osborne Street. There is only one way out. If a wildfire should occur, how would the Ranch evacuate the 225 guests? How would they evacuate the Ranch horses? The road will already be filled with existing residents and animals who must evacuate.

To compound the problem, alcohol will be served at these events. Guests are likely to be smoking outdoors at these events as well. It is a recipe for disaster.

It is unconscionable for the County to permit such uses in this particular location with its known hazards. Imagine the liability the County would face should anyone be killed or the loss of property in the event of a fire. It is a cost no one can afford.

All the science regarding urban/forest interface says that you should reduce the number of people in such an area, not increase the number because fires tend to be caused by humans.

The Hillside Federations strongly urges the County to reject the proposed Middle Ranch CUP.
